Sir,

I have the honour to request Your Royal Highness to inform your Ministers, that a report telegraphed from Cape Town was published here in the "Daily Mail" of the 14th of September to the effect that an expedition consisting of five sealing steamers and a large oil tankard was about to leave Cape Town for Kerguelen for the purpose of hunting sea-elephant and that the sealing parties who were principally Norwegians would probably be landed at the Crozets, Prince Edward and Marion Islands, the blubber and skins being sent periodically to Durban. I should be glad to know whether there is any truth in this report and if so whether it can be stated if sealing has been taking place at the Prince Edward and Marion Islands.

In this connexion I would invite reference to Viscount Milner's despatch No. 587 of the 31st of October 1919 and previous correspondence.
